1. Welcome and Minutes of last Meeting

Derek welcomed everyone and we all made the usual introductions. The reports of the May AGM, and September and November 2008 meetings were approved. These are all on the Branch website and hard copies were posted out just before Christmas. Derek gave a special welcome to our Branch Patron, Ronnie Browne.

2. Chairman's Reports

Derek thanked everyone for coming. He announced that reflexologist Susan McVicker is coming along after the tea break and the first aid suite downstairs is booked for one to one treatments, paid for by the Branch.

According to BBC website and news stem cell research has arrived at a critical stage in Southern General Hospital in Glasgow. But as Derek reminded us, many years ago when we had our speaker on the topic, it's an ongoing thing not the solution to everything – still in the very early stages and unproven. They are trying treatments on stroke victims at the moment. The next stage, in mid 2009, they will be looking for volunteers. Also Barak Obama signed yesterday to allow it to go the next level in the USA.

Derek was called as a volunteer by the ERI to go along for 3rd year medical students to tell them about problems that ataxians have – he's going on Monday 26 Jan. 3. Treasurer's Report

Since 15 November, there has not been a lot of change. Income: Mrs Scott & husband sent a fund raising cheque of £430 from their Halloween party, and a donation of £211.30 from their Mum in law's funeral. Total £641.30. Also £20 from Mrs Scott in lieu of sending Christmas cards

Derek made a £10 donation. The collecting can money from the Nov meeting has now been counted: Tom and Doreen's wee box and the 2 cans from Lasswade contained £26.25. The quarterly bank interest was £10.21 – much better than we used to get from HBOS. Also the usual standing orders came in at the beginning of December and January from Jim Shepherd's daughter £10 and Mr & Mrs Smith £10. Anne-Marie Thomson has been knitting for fund raising, She could do with donations of wool, old quilts to unpick etc.

Expenses were £15 reflexology / massage charge for a member and expenses of £107.60 from Penny for copying and stamps.

7. Any Other Business

Derek suggested a possible speaker from ERI at March meeting: Dr Bryan Allan. He will ask when he sees him next Monday. Dr Bryan is the Simulated Patient co-ordinator at the College of Medicine and Veterinary Medicine at University of Edinburgh - overseeing the examination for junior doctors. Doreen has an idea for a speaker from VOCAL in Johnston Terrace (Voice of Carers across Lothian). A nurse whilst dressing a wound suggested it.

We then discussed the problems with getting housing adaptations eg ramps and aids such as walkers. If you own your own house you have to pay for whole cost. If you are disabled, it is important to apply for help before you are 60, because afterwards you can't get it.

The benefits of hydrotherapy were mentioned – being able to walk in water, The Astley Ainslie treats people one to one in their Special pool with a high temperature (NB you must be referred by your GP or physiotherapist). There is also believed to be a public one at Prestonpans.
